Highlights

You can read the minutes at a later date but here are a few highlights of the meeting:

A pool lift was approved by the board, ARF 1318. It will be paid for by Park Party funds at an amount of \$5500.00. This is the beginning of helping our park be more ADA compliant.

New rules are in place to comply with the 55 + park requirements. All changes to occupancy in your unit must be approved by the Park Manager.

The defibrillators contract are up. The board renewed the contract for an additional 4 years at a cost of \$5612.00 to be paid out of our reserves.

Discussion/Acceptance of ARF 1317, installation of two ductless mini-splits air conditioner/heat pump in the Activity Center Billiards Room.

Discussion/Acceptance of Committee Charters/ Rosters.

Petition presented by Howard Caires – shall the Park permit members to park boats, trailers, rv's in the park during the summer months. Motion #28-23/23 to move petition to a ballot for member's vote.

There will be a ballot issue prohibiting 2 pickup campers and camper vans from parking on members lots.

The ByLaws should be consistent regarding the number of days of notice given to the members. The Board will research, and if necessary will have a ballot written by the next Board Meeting in order to meet the deadline for the Annual Packet.

Vicki and Don Kaffenberger are our new Activity Directors beginning November 1st.

Bill Beron is a new maintenance employee.

Our new chef is Jack Marinelli, with his wife Blythe.

Judy Wilson reported 5 lots were sold/transferred over the summer months. (the names and lot numbers are in this newsletter)

Incumbents, Judy Wilson and Butch Partee, are in the running for the 2 board positions.

Storage lots. Your unit must have current registration and be road worthy. Storage lots are not for long term storage. See this newsletter for further information on new rules and guidelines.

We are working on becoming more ADA Compliant/Compatible. The mailroom is 1st with automatic opening doors. A handicapped lift is on the board agenda for approval.

Due to illegal dumping in the trash area, we are installing entry gates that will be closed and locked at 8 PM. Break down empty boxes and put your trash in the bins in lieu of the large roll away unit at the back of the lot.

When you hire a remodeling contractor you need to tell them they need to take with them the items that are being removed. You pay them for that service; don't let them tell you different.

Weeds and Palm Tree limbs. It is your responsibility to monitor your lots. If you are contacted and do not comply with a plan of action within 10 days, the park will take care of the problem and bill you \$100.00. If you spray sprouting weeds they will not go to seed, which eliminates the spread.

We are putting gravel in front of the dog park to help with water pooling which creates a muddy entrance to the park.

The pool is one of our most costly maintenance items. <u>SHOWERING IS REQUIRED</u> before you enter the pool initially, and after you have spent time sun bathing. The lotions ,along with your sweat, plug up the filters.

The new gates installed in the garbage area are locked at 8 PM and Open at 6 AM.

Put trash in the small dumpsters not the large roll off dumpster.

Respect others. STOP at STOP SIGNS and SLOW DOWN IN THE PARK.


